Special Narrator: John Philip Sousa, IV

On a warm May evening, in 1913, 50,000 people gathered at the Music Pavilion at Willow Grove Park. Suddenly and with great tenacity and emotion the 50 musicians of the JPS band began to play the stirring, "The Stars and Stripes Forever", written and then conducted by John Philip Sousa. Who amongst us would not want to have the chance, even briefly, to experience the March King himself conducting his most beloved and famous composition, accurately known as our country's national march?

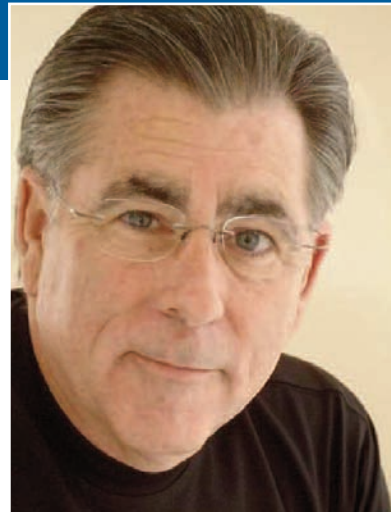
Well, a lucky few of us in 2013, on a warm evening in May will get the chance to hear Sousa conduct the iconic march. This time it will be the Southampton Community Band conducted by John Philip Sousa, IV, the great grandson of John Philip Sousa, a hundred years and seven miles from the original event. We are thrilled and feel honored to play under his baton.

Sousa, IV, like his namesake, wore the uniform of his country, serving for four years in the United States Air Force. And like his great grandfather, he continues to serve the United States. He is the Honorary Chairman and Board Member of *Enduring Freedom, Killed in Action Fund*. Sousa, IV, helped to raise and distribute over 2 million dollars for the families of those who have made the ultimate sacrifice for their country fighting terrorism around the world. In addition, the fund assisted in placing pres-

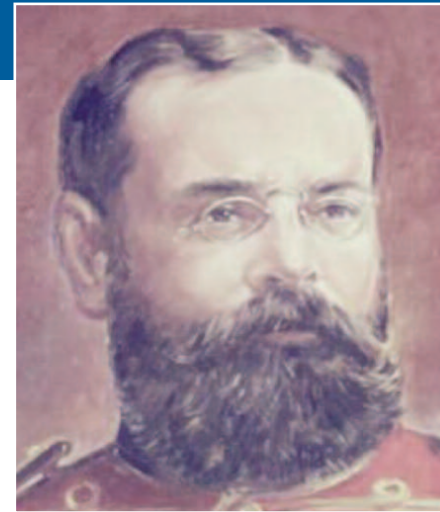

sure on Congress to make sure that the families of our nation's heroes were properly and respectfully cared for. He led the effort to raise the funds necessary to construct the first life-size statue of his great grandfather erected at the Marine Corps barracks in Washington, D.C.

At the age of 11, he was the first civilian to conduct the United States Marine Corps Band on the Capital Steps in Washington, D.C. As he will do for us this evening, he has toured the country sharing stories of the March King, his music and his life. Currently, he serves on the board of advisors of the *Federation for American Immigration Reform* and helps the people at *America 4 R Marines* help those stationed around the world. He is Honorary Chairman of the Congressional Cemetery where his great grandfather rests, and is Chairman of *Americans for Truth and Justice*. He was a consultant to banks in the area of investments and insurance.

Born in New York City, he presently resides in Farmington, Connecticut. Now retired, he spends his time working on Sousa projects, having just published a book with Loras Schissel, *John Philip Sousa's America*, which will be available at a cost of \$35.00 cash or check made payable to John Philip Sousa, IV.
